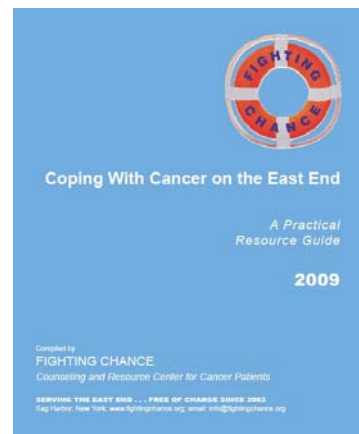


I founded Fighting Chance in 2002, after my mother died of lung cancer, and have been Chairman of the Board since that time.

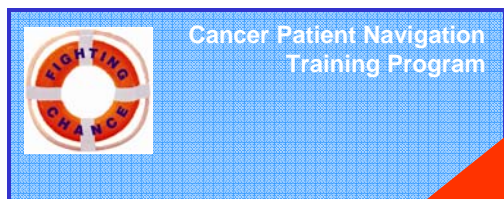


I attended the March 2007 annual meeting of the American Association for Cancer Research and, at that time, completed a four-day training program for cancer patient advocates known as "Scientist-Survivor."



In July 2008 I completed a three-day training program at the cancer patient navigation institute headed by Dr. Harold P. Freeman, a pioneer in the field.

I began my patient advocacy by serving as a local hospice volunteer.



Inspired by Dr. Freeman, I have led Fighting Chance in developing a one-day training program which is an introductory course to the subject of Cancer Patient Navigation.



This new non-profit, which I founded in 2009 as an offshoot of Fighting Chance, is dedicated to developing educational materials for cancer patients which explain the disease in layman's terms. I authored the first pamphlet, which is 44-flip charts and available on our website (www.cancersimplified.org).
